Youth in Cleveland County choose to postpone sexual activity and parenthood until they are physically, emotionally, socially and economically mature enough to understand the responsibilities of having a family. Communities in the county support healthy choices for family planning and have equitable access to high quality, affordable reproductive health services.
Step 2: What does it look like when you achieve this result?	There is a reduction in both the teen pregnancy and teen birth rates in the county leading to a stronger family support structure for all residents of the county.
